



GREEN TEAM NEWS

WALK TO SCHOOL WEEK—Next week (week beginning 24th June) is our annual walk to school week where we encourage as many children as possible to walk, cycle or scoot to school. Last week our Green Team conducted a survey of our Year 5 class ahead of Walk to School Week and found that 35 children across the whole week walked, 14 children cycled or scooted and 97 came by car. This is probably similar to most classes. We are hopeful that we can change these numbers







elements of their lives which make an impact on improving our environment, slowing down climate change etc, e.g. swapping fossil fuels for a wind turbine. Obviously we can't do that here at little old Woodstone but we are encouraging children not to throw things away (i.e. fill landfill) so we are running a book swap - this will run permanently from now on. Children in all year groups can bring a book in to school and swap it with one of the books in our book swap boxes (one for KS1 and another for KS2). They can only swap one book at a time but can swap one a week if they want to!

FUND RAISING CAR WASH

Financial constraints are a regular feature of school life but our Year 6 children wanted to do something which would help the school out and also help parents—they wanted to make their trip to Drayton Manor a little less expensive for mums and dads so they set themselves a target to raise £300 towards the cost of the trip. With this in mind, they have organised a FUNDRAISING CAR-WASH on THURSDAY 27th JUNE (1pm—3pm) on our back playground. Cars will get a wash for just £5—and the great news is that while your car is being washed you can visit their café and get a cup of tea or coffee and a piece of cake or biscuit. You just need to turn up if you'd like to support this great venture.



TRANSITION ARRANGEMENTS

As you know, the academic year is VERY quickly coming to an end, so I wanted to write and let you know our plans for transition (children moving to their next class).

Transition is crucial for children as it helps to put them at ease over the summer holiday and makes starting school a lot easier if they can put a name to a face or start to build a relationship with their new teacher and teaching assistant.

With this all in mind we have allocated Wednesday 26th June AND Thursday 4th July as our 'move up' days. Please note Year 6 'move up' days to their new school are on a whole host of different days. Year 6 children should come to school as normal if they are not attending their new school.

On Wednesday 26th all children should go to their current classroom. They will be registered by their class teacher before being taken to their new classroom.

At the end of the day on Wednesday 26th children should be collected from outside their NEW classroom.

On Thursday 4th children should once again go to their current classroom in the morning and be collected from their NEW classroom.

Children should be in uniform as normal and bring water bottles/PE kits etc.

How does it work?

- At the end, you will receive a certificate with your name on and a medal.


